I hope to include- occasionally, some of the cartoons that I used in my books for your entertainment.

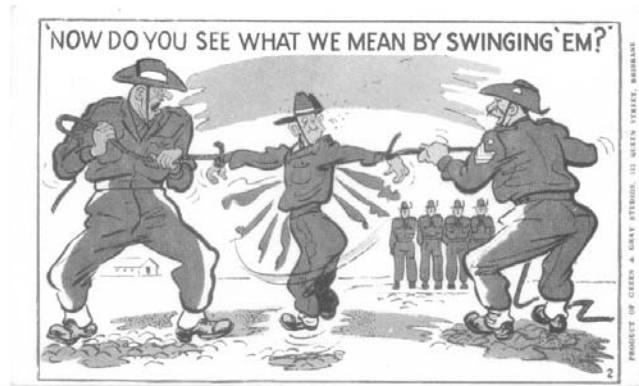
Wishes for a quick recovery to Ted Mercer- one of our very early directory members who is on the mend, I hear, after an operation.

I registered for Nashos when I turned 17, hoping I would go in early so not to lose too much pay as an apprentice joiner. I went in at 18yrs 1 month and think I was the youngest recruit. I recruit was married with a child.

We reported to Nth Sydney drill hall 7/1/55, split into 2 Or 3 groups and bussed to New Holsworthy. On arrival I was offered the job of looking after the "horse". They thought I was from the bush as I wore "can't tear em" jeans and elastic sided boots- the only thing I had ever ridden was my ex army Harley motor cycle (yeah Ted- we know!!!!). All members except 3 came from Sydney Nthn beaches area. 11 outsider came from Sth Sydney and 2 – Vince Duffy and Sheriff Probert came from Wagga Teachers College. Vince became boxing champ and Sheriff was Tennis Champion. We were quartered in 4 marquees which were great in Jan, Feb, March '55- very hot and didn't rain for 3 months. On our first leave, Bruce Miller was killed when his motor cycle hit a power pole at Palm Beach. Bruce was the first person I knew who had died. Several platoon members went to his funeral.

As I was about 6'6" and 6 stone I had to have my uniform made special- it took 2 months, so guards and picquets were only in working gear. We trained on the 40mm Bofor guns. I was the gunner who loaded and fired the gun and yelled out "foot pedal held" to indicate I had applied the safety catch. At the range, I was so nervous that I dropped the clip of rounds on the footplate. They were AP- so safe.

My father did his Militia training at Old Holsworthy in the 20's. He rode the lead horse on the horse-drawn 18 pounder guns. His second camp he drove a 6x6 Thornycroft with solid rubber tyres from Nth Sydney to Old Holsworthy towing a 4.5" howitzer. He told me recently, (he's 99) that the first round they fired landed in the camp!! The camp appears to have had a few names- Bardia Barracks, Kokoda lines and near the officers quarters', near the golf links were markers on the greens with "Khartoum Lines cast on them. Ted Goodman.

Re 3/55 intake, 5 Pl. A Coy.

Quite a lot of us were sent to Puckapunyal in Vic. and we were inducted into the Armoured Corps running around in Centurion tanks for a couple of months.

It was quite different to Holsworthy as we did not have to parade early in the mornings, just get up, go to breakfast, get changed then parade. We didn't have to do any KP duties and also we had rooms with only 2 of us in them. (Did we all do the same N.S. Training- I don't think so!!!) Not all of the chaps went with us. A lot of them (the lucky ones???????) stayed at Holsworthy.
